Children have individual educational needs. Trying to get the best advice and help may seem like a confusing and frightening experience. The thought of approaching the school, Education Leeds and other professional organisations can be intimidating. The Parent Partnership Service is designed to help you, as parents and carers of children, to receive the advice, information and guidance necessary to make the right choices for your child.

Our aim: is to provide flexible services for parents and carers in order to empower them to play an active and informed role in their child's education. This leaflet describes the work we do and lists the different services offered by the Parent Partnership Service.

Impartial advice: for parents, carers and professionals seeking guidance and information on how to meet the educational needs of your child. Our advisers offer guidance on legislation, policies and procedures to help each child receive the educational support they need.

Access to information and support: the Parent Partnership Service has a library of information and access to a network of people and organisations there to help answer your questions and provide support. Independent parent supporters can help guide you through more difficult times including form filling, attendance at official meetings and representation at legal proceedings. In extreme cases, we offer access to independent mediation to help facilitate a resolution between all parties.

Helping parents, carers and schools work together: to create the right environment and encouragement for children. The Parent Partnership Service works closely with teachers to make schools a more welcoming place for parents and carers by providing training for teaching staff and mentors and by working to establish parent support groups.



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Your views matter: the Parent Partnership Service listens to children, parents and carers, professionals and schools to gather ideas and share problems, opinions and views, feeding these back to Education Leeds and other agencies to ensure your voice is heard.

Our target: is to help parents, carers, professionals and schools work together to raise the achievement of children.
